the tastiest meadows,

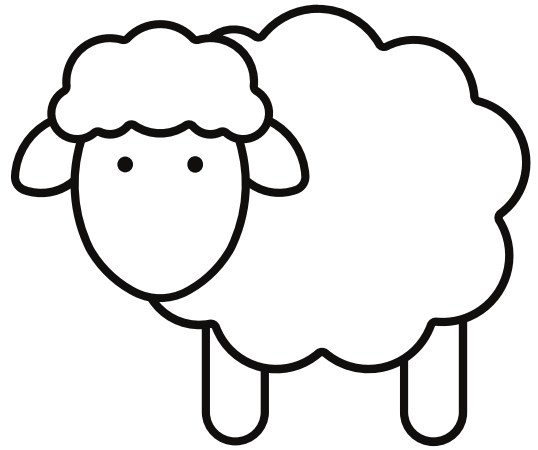
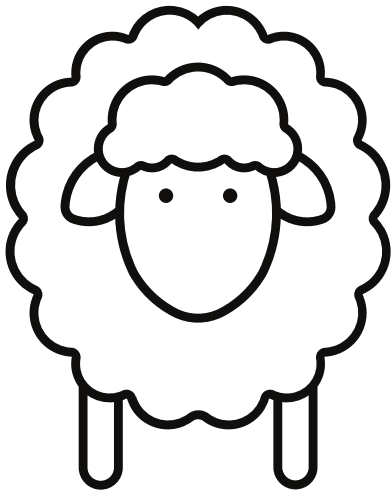
and a child with a heart full of love and a gift for everyone.
